Purpose: It shall be the responsibility of all members of Fire District 8 to provide a safe and healthy work environment for its members.

Procedure:

- 1. Management's Responsibilities.
 - a) The Fire District shall establish, supervise, maintain, and enforce in an effective manner:
 - i. A safe and healthful working environment, as it applies to noncombat conditions or to combat conditions at a fire scene after the fire has been extinguished, as determined by the officer in charge.
 - ii. An accident prevention program.
 - iii. Programs for training employees in the fundamentals of accident prevention.
 - iv. Procedures to be used by the DSO and IC to ensure that emergency medical care are provided for members on-duty.
 - v. Suitable expertise to comply with all testing requirements in WAC 296-305 or as prescribed by law.
 - vi. Such expertise may be secured from within the District, from equipment and apparatus manufacturers, or other suitable sources.
 - vii. A bulletin board or posting area exclusively for safety and health, large enough to display the required safety and health poster, and have it be provided in each station.
 - viii. The WISHA poster (WISHA form F416-081-000) and other safety education material shall be posted to these boards.
 - ix. The District shall maintain a hazard communication program as required that will provide information to all members relative to hazardous chemicals or substances to which they are exposed to in the course of their employment.
- 2. Member and Employee Responsibilities.
 - a) Members and Employees shall:
 - i. Cooperate with the Fire District and other members in an effort to eliminate accidents.

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- ii. Be responsible for contributing to a safe working environment due to the inherent risks of the occupation.
- iii. Immediately notify their immediate supervisor of unsafe work practices and/or unsafe equipment, apparatus, or work places.
- iv. Apply the principles of accident prevention in their work.
- v. Use all required safety devices and protective equipment as provided by the Fire District.
- vi. Take proper care of issued personal protective equipment as outlined in (see SOP 40.03.02).
- vii. Attend required training and/or orientation programs designed to increase their competency in occupational safety and health.
- viii. When under the influence of alcohol or drugs, members will not participate in any Fire District operations or other functions.
 - 1. The only exception will be where a physician or dentist prescribes medications provided that such medication does not endanger the member or others (see SOP 40.01.10).
