will not occur in our region again but realistically, it's not if but when. I ask you to please be prepared for fire season! There are important steps you can take as a citizen to prepare. The first is to recognize when severe fire weather occurs in our area. We never know when or where a fire may occur or from what direction it will come.

That kind of uncertainty means creating evolving evacuation plans as we prepare. The second is to create and manage defensible space around your home or community. You will find helpful links in the newsletter.

The fire district continually looks for ways to be prepared to

**serve you**. An important way to prepare is to plan. The Board of Fire Commissioners recently adopted the 2024-2026 Fire District 8 Strategic Plan. 

# Wildfire Ready Neighbors

Keep your property lean and green to help protect your family and home. Defensible space, coupled with home hardening, is essential to improve your home's chance of surviving a wildfire. Defensible space is the buffer you create between a building on your property and the grass, trees, shrubs, or any wildland area that surround it. This space is needed to slow or stop the spread of wildfire and it helps protect your home from catching fire—either from embers, direct flame contact or radiant heat. Proper defensible space also provides firefighters a safe area to work in, to defend your home.

# Stay Safe With These Lithium-Ion Battery Safety Tips

- Purchase and use devices that are listed by a qualified testing laboratory.
- Always follow the manufacturer's instructions.
- Only use the battery that is designed for the device.
- Put batteries in the device the right way.
- Only use the charging cord that came with the device.
- Do not charge a device under your pillow, on your bed, or on a couch.
- Do not keep charging the device or device battery after it is fully charged.
- Keep batteries at room temperature when possible.
  Do not charge them at temperatures below 32°F (0°C) or above 105°F (40°C).
- Store batteries away from anything that can catch fire.

Lithium-ion batteries supply power to many kinds of devices including smart phones, laptops, e-scooters and e-bikes, e-cigarettes, smoke alarms, toys, and even cars. If not used correctly, or if damaged, these batteries can catch on fire or explode.
